

## Galena Park I.S.D.

The Galena Park Independent School District is located east of Houston. It encompasses the incorporated cities of Galena Park, Jacinto City, and a portion of Houston as well as a large area of unincorporated Harris County.

Within the district, serving a population of approximately 22,000, there is one early childhood center, 15 elementary schools (K-5), one sixth-grade school, one K-8 school, one middle school (6-8), two middle schools (7-8), three high schools (one 9-12, one 9, one 10-12) including an Accelerated Center for Education. The district also provides a PEP Child Development Center, a Center for Success, a Community Night School and participates in a Multi-District Alternative School.

Located just 25 miles from downtown Houston, Galena Park is surrounded by four community colleges and five four year colleges or universities.

- A score of 3 or higher on a College Board Advanced Placement exam,
- A score of 4 or higher on an International Baccalaureate exam,
- A GPA of 3.0 or higher on a college course taken for high school credit,
- Products of professional quality as judged by a panel of professionals,
- Original research/projects conducted under the direction of mentors,
- Special recognition on National Merit Scholar Qualifying exam.
